

## SENSORY SHARK BOTTLE

## Top tips

- Make sure your shark material is water proof
   we suggest a foam or sponge material
- Try different colours, no one said it must be blue! Why not a purple ocean?
- To ensure there are no leaks tape or glue the top of the bottle shut so you can shake it about
- A mixture of loose glitter and glitter glue will give the water the best consistency!

# DIY TERRARIUM

A terrarium is a small fully, functioning plant ecosystem.

### What you'll need

Glass bowl or jar **Potting soil Small rocks** 

An assortment of small indoor plants

An assortment of decorations and toys (moss, grassy rocks, mushrooms, coloured sand, garden gnomes, toy animals... the list is endless!)

- 2. Fill the glass jar with potting soil about 2/3rds full.
- 3. Pick an assortment of small indoor plants and plant 2-3 plants in each terrarium.
