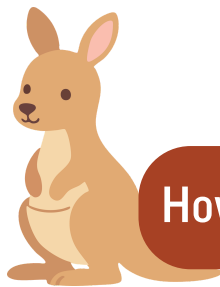

Animal homes

Turning the tap off after you wash your hands	

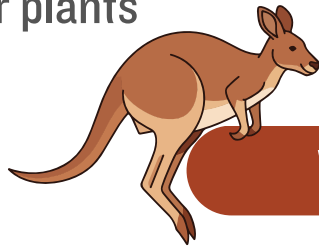


LOOKING AFTER OUR WORLD

TRICKY TONGUES AND TREETOPS

Some animals have special ways to find food.

Echidnas use long sticky tongues.

Tree kangaroos live up in trees.

ZONE: DAINTREE RAINFOREST

RAINFOREST ANIMALS

Rainforest animals need trees and plants.
Cassowaries eat fruit and help forests grow.

LOOK...

What can you see in the rainforest?

TALK...

Why do animals need trees?

DRAW

Draw a rainforest habitat.

ZONE: KANGAROO WALKABOUT

KANGAROO

Kangaroos eat grass and plants.

They need space to move and find food.

LOOK...

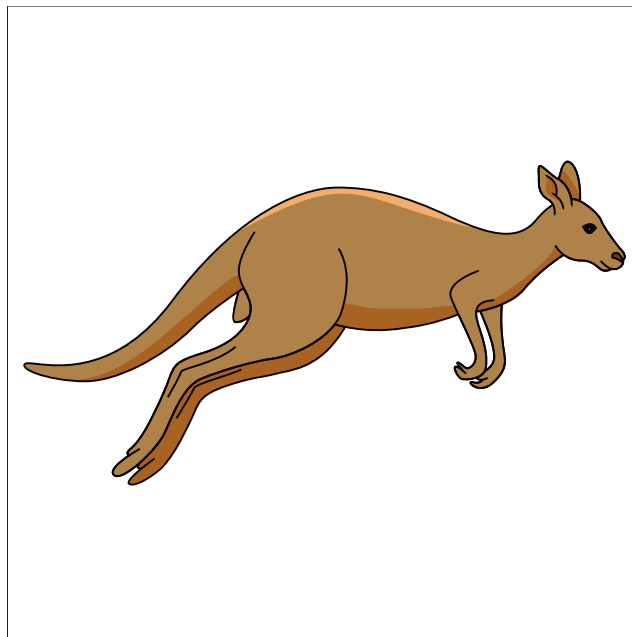
What is the kangaroo eating?

TALK...

What does it need to live?

MOVE...

Hop like a kangaroo!



ZONE: NIGHTFALL

NIGHT ANIMALS

Some animals are awake at night.

Sugar gliders live in trees and glide between branches.

LOOK...

Where is the animal?

TALK...

Why does it need trees?

DRAW...

Draw a glider in a tree.



ZONE: CROCODILE BILLABONG

CROCODILE

Crocodiles live in water.

They need water to stay safe and find food.

LOOK...

Is the crocodile in the water?

TALK...

Why does it need water?

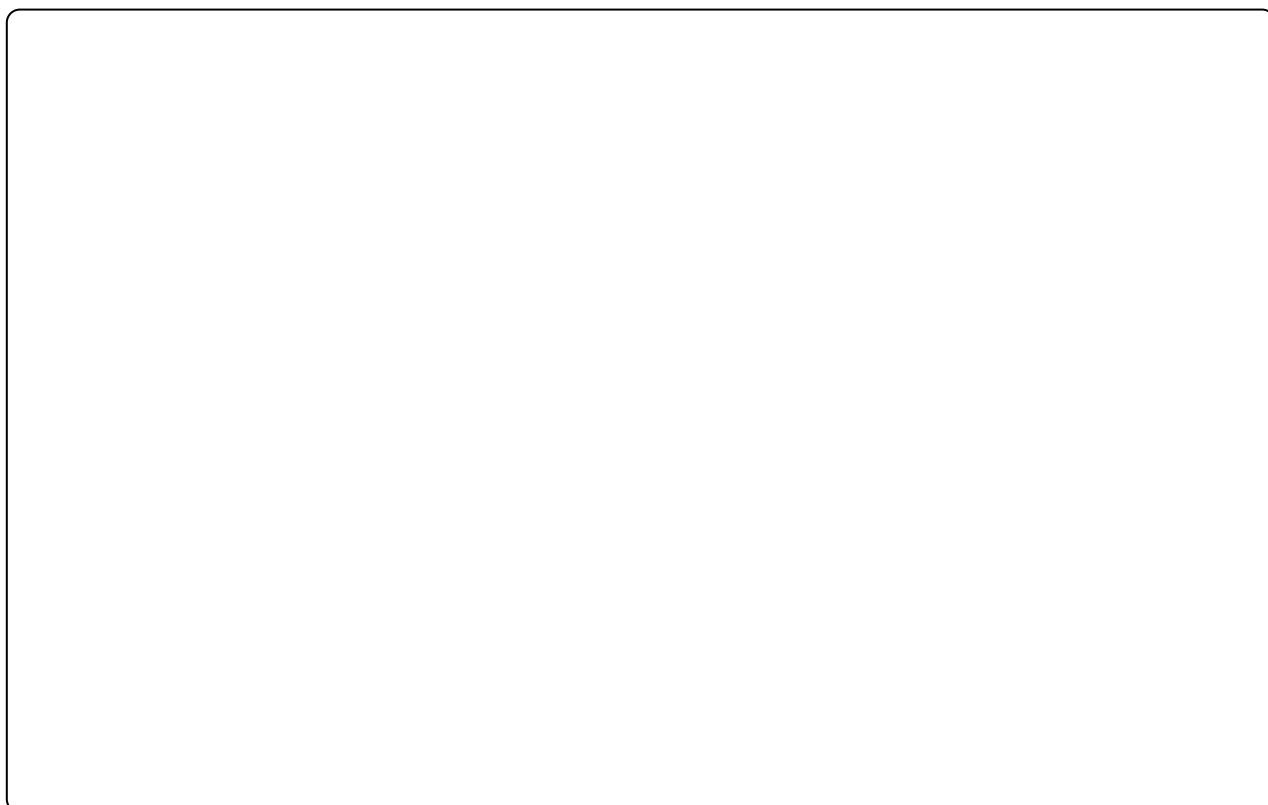
DRAW...
